Full Adoption of spine roads between NCC Highways and TW is still subject to agreement and negotiation relating to the Deed of Discharge for the storm water drainage system.

This has now been referred to NCC Highways and their response will be subject to a review at the May 16<sup>th</sup> Meeting of MPC.

DWH are hoping to meet with KBC 28<sup>th</sup> April (waiting for Peter Chaplin to confirm) regarding the transfer of the POS areas from DHW to KBC in line with the S.106 agreement. These areas are ready and at an adoptable standard.

Full adoption of the roads is subject to the settlement of the Deed of Discharge with TW and in the interim DE have confirmed that they have requested a site visit with NCC to move the snagging of the DWH parcels forward and ensure they are ready for adoption. Stacey Poole (DE) will contact Chris Bond's team to arrange a site meeting as soon as possible.

The request made to DE, to deal with rutting damage caused by vehicles driving onto the grass verge at No: 82 Old Gorse Way.

This has been resolved and DE are looking at suitable signage to prevent vehicle access damage to The Round.

➤ Overgrown vegetation at the Electricity Sub- Station off Loddington Way, is being dealt with by KBC in liaison with Weston Power.
