On Sunday 13th November, over 150 people from our village community gathered in the mist at the Leonard Carrington memorial for the Mawsley village Act of Remembrance. The service, led by Revd. Nicki Hobbs, was attended by Cllr Jim Hakewill, members of the Mawsley Parish Council, Mawsley Community Primary School and local uniformed organisations. It included a recital of In Flanders Fields, prayers and an Act of Commitment led by Cubs and Scouts. After the Last Post, two minutes silence and the Reveille, local groups and individual laid wreaths in memory of the fallen. After the service a collection was taken which raised almost £200, split between the Royal British Legion and Mawsley Church. Thank you to all who attended and took part in any way.

Mawsley Coffee Club

Mawsley Villagers Association

The MVA is the village charity established in 2006. The charity is registered with the Charity Commission and has the grand objective of "improving the conditions of life for Mawsley villagers". In practice this means:

• Responsibility for the Centre at Mawsley

The MVA holds the lease for the Centre from the Parish Council and the MVA has created a Community Interest Company called TCAM to manage the Centre. It is TCAM that is responsible for running the Centre on a day-to-day basis.

· Organising events and projects for the village

The MVA has actively organised events for Mawsley in recent years these have included: the annual firework display and TCAM radio during the Covid shutdown. Recent projects have included the Mawsley magazine, Christmas lights and the woodland path refurbishment (with the MPC).

• Providing support funding to help village groups

Funding is provided to help a new group get up and running or to help a group with short term financial issues. The charity has helped with support funding to Mawsley school, Mums & Tots and the scouts and has also provided financial risk cover for village events such as Mawsley Dramatics.


Fund raising

their first year of life "smile more"! Music sessions can also provide some very special moments for bonding with your little one whilst simultaneously building a new network of friends for you both! At Music Makers, we host fun and engaging sessions for little ones of mixed ages and needs, from babies through to pre-schoolers, as we strongly believe that children can learn so much from each other as well as from their adults. 1st Mawsley Scout Group

The Group re-opened in September 2021, following Covid-19 enforced closure. Since then the Cubs and Scouts have enjoyed a varied programme.

One of the highlights in June 2022 was the summer weekend camp to Walesby Forest, where 5 adults, 26 children and 1 Duke of Edinburgh volunteer took part in an action packed weekend. The whole experience took place under canvas with the children being able to experience rafting, archery, axe throwing, crate stacking, kayaking, caving, climbing, shooting, swimming, evening fires, hot chocolate and smores (the "must have" of any scouting experience). The Group would formally like to record its thanks to Mawsley Village Association. The MVA provided the group with funding

of £983.75, which enabled it to purchase 5 tents and additional catering equipment which was used at the Walesby Forest camp.

The 2022 autumn term's activities continue with a pancake session at Gallone's, making bird feeders, a night hike on the Brampton Valley Way, Emergency Aid, a session at the John Lowther Centre, and will culminate in an evening at the Pinnacle Climbing Centre.

Mawsley Parish Council

Who we are and what we do

What springs to mind when someone mentions 'The Parish Council' ... would it be the Vicar of Dibley or the infamous Jackie Weaver? Thankfully neither are a true representation of a working parish council. In Mawsley your parish council consists of 7 volunteer Councillors and one Officer who is employed by the council. Your councillors all either live or work in Mawsley village or within 3 miles of it. On average every 4 years there are council elections, the last ones being in 2021. During the election all previous councillors finish and new ones are either elected or, if not enough people come forward, they would be co-opted later on. Occasionally there are vacancies throughout the 4-year term, these are usually filled by co-option. The role of your parish council is to support you, our residents. We act as a liaison between our residents and the principle authority which is North Northants Council. Mawsley is in a unique position as it is a new village, as many of you are aware a lot of the roads and open spaces in the village have not yet been adopted by North

Northants Council, this means that certain roads including the streetlights are still owned and managed by the developer who built that area of the village. The Parish Council can help liaise between the residents in those areas and the developer when issues arise. The parish council can also help with village events, manage items such as salt bins and dog waste bins, plant and maintain additional trees and provide allotments. We also own the building that is TCAM. The parish council helps to finance the Centre so that it remains a focus for the community in our village.

Over the next couple of editions of the new Mawsley Magazine I will go into more detail about what we do as well as explain terms such as precept and audit. You will also be able to read more about your councillors, why they chose to put themselves forward to serve the community and lastly, my role and how I work for you and your council.

NEWS AND INFORMATION FROM THE CENTRE AT MAWSLEY

The village has welcomed many newcomers since the last Mawsley Magazine, and the Team TCAM felt it would be beneficial to give some information about the Centre, who runs it and what it has to offer.

The Centre was officially opened in 1907 and has served the community ever since. The Centre is constituted as a Community Interest Company with a Board of five Directors who are responsible for the governance of its activities, ensuring it is, indeed, serving the interests of the community and compliant with all current Health & Safety Regulations, Fire Safety and Licencing Law.

The day-to-day activities are managed by two Office Managers, Nicola Wisdom, and Claire Thorpe. Nicola and Claire are assisted in their busy roles by a Bar Supervisor, Grace Foster, and a team of fully trained Bar Staff.

Everyone is welcome at the Centre, whether from the village community or outside and is open from 9.00am. The premises have the benefits of a Licence to Sell Alcohol, for consumption on or off the premises and that Licence also covers a range of Licensable including Performance of Dance, Films, Plays and Live Music, to name a few.

The Centre welcomes all children and, in accordance with Licensing Law, must operate under the following conditions:

Children age under 14 until 9.00pm each evening, always accompanied by an appropriate adult.

15 – 17-year-olds are welcome until closing and must be accompanied by an appropriate adult from 9.00pm.

The Centre also benefits from a large hall, able to accommodate up to 120 people and a smaller meeting room, both of which are available for hire via the Office. For the better weather there is also an outside seating area with the benefit of two large Jumbrellas containing heating elements for cooler evenings, offering a shade from strong sunshine in the summer and shelter from the rain.
