Older children's play area one step closer

We are running towards an older children's play area – with just one (big!) hurdle to go.

The lack of facilities for older children / young people (broadly those over about 10 / 11), is the single biggest failing in the design of the village.

Finding equipment that would appeal to such a wide age range was in itself quite a challenge. Nevertheless a challenge overcome, as we have identified a range of sturdy stainless steel kit guaranteed to both provide hours of fun and also use up the energy of even those most full of beans. It is also attractive and stylish. And yes, for anyone from 10 to 18 - and maybe to 58!

The plan also extends to re-erecting the basketball hoops & goals, which were on the playing field before the sports pitches were laid, with tarmac areas in front of each.

This will all go in the area beyond the grasscrete, between the football and cricket pitches.

I mentioned a big hurdle – it's the money. The overall cost is £53,600, so finding grants is really the core issue. We have focussed on the grants available from the Landfill Tax, which has the great benefit of normally aiming to fund the majority of a project's costs (most grant schemes do not).

Not unnaturally it is a very competitive process to get that funding but the good news is that we have got through the first stage and have been asked to submit a full application. To be clear, this does not in any way guarantee that the full application will be successful - even for part of the money - but it's a good start.

So 'when?' I hear you ask. The decision will take some weeks once the full application has been submitted, which has to be by the 22nd March.

The Maud Elkington Trust has got the ball rolling by kindly giving us a grant of £1250.

I would also like to thank on your behalf Kettering Borough Council who have undertaken to inspect and maintain the equipment in perpetuity and to insure it. This is a vital contribution as the expertise and ongoing costs required for this are substantial.

This process has taken a long time and a lot of effort but we are now closer to seeing it come to fruition than ever before. The MVA will make the best case it can in its grant application and I hope to be able to bring you good news in a few months' time.





(continuing to look at issues we face in running The Centre)

Firstly I would like to thank the two villagers who have volunteered their expertise in response to my description of our coffee machine dilemma.

TAKINGS

All we have to do is to take the money from the till and put in the bank – right?

If it were my business, and my money, then that's probably all I would do. But it's not my business – it's yours. Therefore we have a detailed process to reconcile cash amounts vs. the amounts the tills tell us we have taken vs. bank credits **every day**.

Equally this extends to card takings too. We reconcile the amounts being paid into the bank by the card issuers with the amounts on the till and the amounts advised (by the tills) to the card authorisers. This is sometimes tricky as there is a delay of 3-5 days between the card transaction at the bar and the money appearing in the bank – complicated by takings after midnight appearing on the till for the full day (e.g. Friday) but going into the following day (i.e. Saturday) on the card system.

So checking it takes time, but check it we must, otherwise we would not have discovered as we did recently that bank entries vs. known takings were down by £272.20 across 10 days.

After much investigation we have established that the tills, just before they packed up, were not forwarding some transactions. As the tills have been replaced that information is lost.

However we keep paper copies - the ones the customer signs - of all card transactions; we will be able to use these to prove the transactions to the card issuer; and therefore get the money.

So as you can see, running the finance at The Centre is not quite as simple and a lot more time-consuming for Debs (our Admin Officer), our accountants, and the volunteer Directors, than you may think.

Parish Council Report

Happy New Year from the Parish Council. We hope you all had a great Christmas!

Community Fund

Firstly we'd like to remind you of The Village Community Fund

What is it?

A pot of money provided by the developers for "the maintenance of the community building" and "support for recreational or artistic activities". The Fund belongs to the village, and is managed by the Parish Council. To be clear, it is not the Parish Council's money; simply they consider and decide upon applications for grants from it.

The rules of the Fund are simple:

- The project must be of benefit to the Parish and/ or a significant number of parishioners.
- Maximum grant is 75% of the total project cost i.e. at least 25% must come from the group's own resources, or from other grant sources. Minimum grant is £250.
- Evidence of spend, receipts for both the grant amount and total amount (so the 75% maximum can be verified), is required.
- A business plan is required for applications above £5,000.

To date the Fund has helped:

- The Centre. As the only fittings provided were carpets and curtains the Fund contributed towards equipping the building: e.g. all the bar, lounge and cellar; all the tables and chairs; shelving in the storeroom / cupboards; till system etc.. Loans have also been made from the Fund to help cover trading losses.
- The Cricket Club, Scouts, WI, Youth Group, Mawsley Church; Baby & Toddler Group and Mawsley Amateur Dramatics have all benefited from grants too.

So if your group would like help towards a project then maybe the Community Fund can help. The first step is to contact the Parish Clerk (Diana MacCarthy mawsleyclerk@tiscali.co.uk). The Fund stands at over £30,000 currently, but once it's gone it's gone!

Future Planning & Development

In November, we received a presentation from Julia Baish of Kettering Borough Council regarding a consultation on future planning and development in and around Mawsley, referred to in the minutes of the November meeting. We are pleased to confirm that emerging policy for Mawsley is that of restraint, with any development in or adjacent to the village being likely to be small scale to meet local community needs. Large scale development would not fit with emerging policy.

Road markings & Speed Limits

December's meeting saw Cllr Jim Harker and Chris Bond from the County Council consulting with us on road and pavement plans for the village. We're offering our suggestions of where we'd like to see road markings; what sort of signage we feel is appropriate; zig-zag markings by the school entrance; a pedestrian crossing near the entrance to Barnwell Court; and a revision of the newly painted rights of way/road layout round the island outside the Surgery. Any comments or suggestions you may have will be considered and passed on. We can't guarantee we'll get everything we want agreed by the Highways Department, but we can at least make our case.

We are pushing to have more of the lights turned on at the entrances to the village, on safety grounds. The County Council are also discussing plans to make Mawsley a 20mph zone, while reducing the speed limit between the 2 entrances to 40mph, with wooden sign structures at each end to better mark the transition to and from national speed limit. We hope you'll agree, these steps should make our village even safer.

Mawsley Parish Council

Meetings

The **Parish Council** meets on the first Monday of the month, in the meeting room at The Centre at 7.30pm. Members of the public may attend and there is time at the beginning of the meeting for them to speak to raise issues and ask questions for consideration at a subsequent meeting.

The next meetings will be on:

6th February and 5th March

The agenda for each meeting is posted on the two village notice boards before the meeting and on the village website.

(There is one notice board on Loddington Way close to the cycle path near the second entrance to the village. The other one is on the green at the bottom Sloe Lane at its junction with Hedgerow Lane and Pasture Close.)



Watching Birds in Mawsley (feathered!)

Is your garden a 'MUST VISIT' place for local birds? It could be if you want it to be. When first we took over our house from the rubble masters, seven years ago, we occasionally saw a daredevil sparrow. We have now recorded 24 separate species in our garden. How has this happened? Firstly this new environment of more than 1000 back and front gardens and yards and the many thousands of window ledges provide a much richer year round habitat for garden birds than did the 10 open fields which were here before Mawsley. Secondly we have managed to control the local cats and, thirdly, we provide year round food for the birds.

Cats are the greatest deterrent here and I will write about how we have managed to keep them away from the birds in our garden in a future article. Perhaps you have suggestions of your own on that subject – please make them via the editor.

Through what we grow in our garden and what we put in our bird feeders we have created year round food supplies for birds; not the Summer/Autumn only seeds of previous times. As birds find these regular stocks they attract more of their species and then birds of similar species. Quite quickly you will find more birds and more of each type in your garden at the same time. If you feed them regularly in a sheltered environment they will return regularly to the free food – birds are definitely NOT stupid.

Once the birds are visiting it's really interesting to watch and learn whether you are 7 or 70; and a marvellous alternative to TV for Mums with small kids to amuse. If you need an excuse to sit for an hour watching the birds in your own garden why not take part in the RSPB's BIG GARDEN BIRDWATCH which takes place on 28th and 29th January? Even if you don't fill in the form you will find a very useful and colourful identification chart of the top ten garden birds on their website under the heading *What to look for*.
