### Mawsley Parish Council

On numerous occasions, in this Newsletter, we have explained various aspects of the relationship between the Parish Council, the Mawsley Villagers Association and The Centre at Mawsley. Nonetheless I guess many villagers would find it difficult to explain precisely what that relationship is.

Another facet of this is explaining why, and to what extent, the Parish Council gives financial support to The Centre.

So, and also prompted by the Parish Council's auditor, we have put it all together in one document, which is focused in particular on the way in which The Centre is run and paid for. This is now on the Council's website: http://www.mawsleyvillage.co.uk/parish-council-documents

On the website too, and directly relevant to the above, is the timetable for the process to set the Council's budget for 2016/17. Relevant because a large proportion of the Council's revenue, raised by the precept (i.e. as added to your Council Tax), goes towards supporting The Centre. You will see from the timetable that the process starts imminently, even though we do not have to advise Kettering Council of the precept level until the end of January.

This means that if you have any comments, suggestions or objections to the way in which the Parish Council spends your money there is plenty of time to make those views clear. You can come along to Council meetings, or advise the Clerk.

If you don't let us know your views then, as I said in the previous Newsletter, we have to do what we think you want; perhaps not always the same as what you actually want.

#### **The Adoption Process**

At the 21<sup>st</sup> September meeting, Parish Council were able to confirm, that the resolution of the storm water drainage issue was progressing well and that an agreement should be reached shortly with the landowner and TW.

#### **David Wilson Homes**

A meeting with DWH managers and the project manager of Developers Eyes, who are providing professional services on the works programme, was arranged with myself and fellow resident, Mr Jim Yates, on Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup> October.

The reason for this meeting was to establish with them, a commitment to implement the adoption process of the development and the eventual transfer of responsibilities to Kettering Borough and Northamptonshire Councils.

Anthony Sibson on behalf of DWH and Stacey Poole on behalf of DE, outlined a robust commitment to process the adoption works programme starting with a review of the 'defect list' which was specific to landscaping and Public Open Space and this will be followed by an inspection by DE and County Council on the standards relating to the roads, drainage and street lighting, once the spine roads have been adopted.


At the MPC meeting on September 21<sup>st</sup>, Cllr Jim Hakewill also confirmed that it had been highlighted in the village newsletter [The Adoption Process] but that he had not received any comments from villagers in relation to this and also confirmed that without concern being raised by villagers, it was hard to get the County Council to prioritise Mawsley over other un-adopted roads in the County and that the adoption of Public Open Space was still ongoing.

KBC are working with the developers to achieve agreement on handing over areas for adoption with mutually agreed funding. It is a complex area but the aim is to conclude an agreement as soon as possible.



### Northamptonshire Police

#### **Specials**

Visible policing is an issue which is often brought to my attention by many local people across the county. I recognise the importance of a visible police force and as such, upon my appointment as the Police and Commissioner, I committed to protecting the 1,220 frontline officers; indeed Northamptonshire is one of only five forces in the country which has not reduced the number of its fulltime, regular officers. In addition to this, and to further increase the capacity and resource of Northamptonshire Police, I set the Force the ambitious target of increasing its Special Constabulary to 900 Special Constables; that's 900 additional officers on our streets and in our communities. I am now pleased to announce that Northamptonshire Police now has over 500 Special Constables!

This is a huge achievement giving Northants Police the largest Special Constabulary per head of population and the largest ratio of Specials to regular officers, in the country. This is testament not only to the hard work of the Force, but also the fantastic support of local people who want to give something back their community.

Special Constables are a vital asset to the Force and have contributed a great deal to Northamptonshire Police Force in this year alone; so far our recruits have made over 500 arrests and recorded over 1,000 crimes. Specials have and will continue to provide a valuable resource to enhance the work

#### **Anglian Water**

Clare Pillinger, on behalf of Anglian Water and the on-going commitment by them to keep the village pumping station at Symonds Way clear of blockages, has recently provided a report that indicates considerable improvements with only 1 maintenance job attributable to pump blockages in March 2015 compared to 4 in within the same time frame last year.

Hopefully, this improvement is in some way attributable to the awareness programme and that our primary school pupils have assisted by taking the message home from the July Mad Science assembly!

#### What is a fatberg?

By the time that the latest fatberg was discovered in a sewer in Chelsea last April, it had expanded to a 10 -tonne mass of fat and wet wipes. Not quite as heavy as the one in Kingston on Thames in 2013 but still, at 40 metres long, it was enough to cause £400,000 of damage to the 1940s-era sewer it was found in.

Such monstrosities form when household waste clumps together. In 2011, people were reminded not to pour fat from cooking Christmas dinners down the sink as it blocks up sewer pipes. Thames Water said it had been called out 101 times on Christmas Day in 2010 to deal with blockages. Put the fat in a container, it said, and, once it has cooled down, dispose of it in the bin.



### World Championship Celebrations at Brackley and Brixworth

After a dramatic, suspense-filled Sunday the 11<sup>th</sup> of October afternoon at the Russian Grand Prix in Sochi, the team's engine factory in Brixworth and the Petronas car's construction plant at Brackley were filled with scenes of celebration, as staff at both sites marked a landmark moment in Mercedes-Benz motorsport history.



### Nature on your doorstep

**Nature on your doorstep** – a stroll round Mawsley & District with Les and Paul (no dog, no wives just us and the rain).

As we made our way over towards Old Poor's Gorse Les and I had to comment on the splendid vivid Autumn colours of the surrounding trees and hedges. In contrast to the dreary slate grey sky the reds, oranges and golds, brightened up the view ahead and encouraged us to explore further. This Autumn being especially wonderful, starting on cue in September and still ongoing taking us in to November as the trees hang on to their precious cargo reluctant to give them up to the woodland floor. However, once fallen providing a perfect site for various species of fungi and bacteria to establish themselves and create tomorrows soil for future generations of plants.

The woods were quiet apart from the odd blackbird foraging in the fallen leaves after a tasty titbit and a crow or two. We came across a single large diameter burrow with a heap of freshly excavated clay soil. In a line coming from the ancient hedge to the hole we could clearly make out piles of leaves and dry grass possibly left behind by a lone boar badger preparing his winter retreat from the main sett.

Old Poor's Gorse is an ideal spot for one of our local deer species to live namely the Muntjac. Muntjac are small, stocky and russet brown in colour in summer and grey/brown in winter. The haunches are higher than the withers giving a hunched appearance. These fine animals are generally solitary in nature or found in pairs (doe with kid or buck with doe). They do not have a defined breeding season but breed all year round. You may have heard a repeated loud bark coming from Old Poor's Gorse usually in early morning or late afternoon. When heard this can be quite eerie and gives the Muntjac its common name of Barking Deer.

Talking of scary noises, as the days get colder and frost starts to settle on a clear night (usually November) you may well hear a scream coming from an area of open land. This is likely to be a Fox vixen calling for a mate. Her call can carry for miles across open country and is so eerie that police have been called out on occasions to investigate an apparent assault or worse based solely on the disturbing sound. On the subject of scary a Barn Owl seen low in the sky can appear ghost like. Strangely it is Halloween as I write.

Little known fact Wood Pigeons and Collared Doves breed all the year round!

flocks. More safety and warmth in larger numbers. Although wild food is abundant at this time of year keep putting small amounts of food out and the flocks will be back in your garden as temperature drops and winter closes in.

You might be wondering why Old Poor's Gorse is named as it is. We were in the wood where the radio mast is situated, of course, and there is an ancient path that runs direct to the village of Old (Wold) from there. It is thought that, ages ago, the poor people of Wold were allowed to gather wood, game and nuts/fruit to take home without charge. Anyone who goes into the wood will notice how very old some of the trees are and it is thought that this area was once part of Rockingham Forest, which stretched from Stamford to Northampton in the time of King William 1 – who used the forest for hunting.

The wood is renowned for its moth life and a particular interest at this time of year is the winter moth. Unusually this is out and about right the way through until March and is often seen in the headlights of cars. The female is flightless and it climbs up the tree trunks to await the arrival of the male. The wood is the perfect habitat for this moth because the wide variety of trees provides its food.

Another notable feature of the wood was the thick carpet of a plant related to the onion family. It does have garlic in the colloquial name, but do not be fooled into thinking that this particular one is edible.

I must correct a mistake I made in the last issue of News and Views when I mistakenly said that Ash Die Back was caused by a virus. Of course it is spread by a wind born fungus. Incidentally, a villager has reported to the Parish Council that he thought there might be Ash Die Back in the Spinney. As I said last time, I have not been able to find any of the classic symptoms, but it has been reported to the appropriate authorities.
