Maintenance and the adoption process

The next phase of the road works along School Road will continue into late January 2012, with the inevitable disruption, but at least the work has been carried out progressively by Taylor Wimpey and hopefully they will complete within the target dates they have set.

Bus service

The bus route to the surgery has once again had to be withdrawn due to the road works and this has raised concerns from bus users from the surgery end of the village and visitors from outside Mawsley attending the medical centre.

Obviously, it is understandable that the buses are not able to negotiate the road works, but with the inconvenience this is causing and the advent of another harsh winter, we have requested that Stagecoach look at an alternative return route from the surgery.

Lifebuoy missing from pond

There is evidence that the Lifebuoy has been removed by burning through the nylon line. This is an act of petty vandalism and theft, which thankfully is not typical of the village and the pond location. The Lifebuoy is a basic safety requirement, especially when the pond can be at a depth of over 4 feet.

Play Area Improvements

Assuming all goes to plan, by the time you read this the new fence around the play area will be in place.

When the MVA worked with Kettering Council to get this play area (and the Council paid for it and own it), we costed out a suitable fence. However quotes for a metal one were in the region of £10,000 !!! Going ahead with a fence would have meant £10,000 less for equipment. We decided to hang fire; to see if events would show if we really needed one and if so hopefully find a cheaper alternative.

Dogs depositing liquid in the play area, plus the need to protect the youngest children from the bikes, footballs etc. of the older ones, showed we really should fence it off.

The MVA looked at various alternatives; however putting a fence there is one thing, maintaining it long-term in good condition is quite another.

Ecoplasticwood

Then, eureka, we found a solution. The new fence looks like wood but is actually made entirely from recycled plastic. This means it is very strong, won't deteriorate (so no splinters) and will never rot (so no painting). So it also hits lots of "eco" buttons. We are very grateful to Ecoplasticwood Ltd., who have supplied and erected it at a special price. It has been paid for out of Parish Council funds and it's only cost just over half of that original £10,000.

We have been very impressed by how quickly our new children in the Foundation Stage have settled in to their first full days of education.

Year 1 children have been very proactive this term by exploring local facilities with a village walk. They also made suggestions to improve our amenities in Mawsley that included a train station and a swimming pool. These suggestions have been passed on to the County Council for approval!

There is a party atmosphere in the air in Year 2 as they end the term with a Brazilian carnival to celebrate their South American topic and to say goodbye to Mrs. De La Salle who leaves to have her first baby. All the staff and governors wish her the very best of luck with her new arrival!

The children in Year 3 have been exploring the traditional tale of Peter and the Wolf which has really captured their imagination, producing some excellent work both at school and at home.

There have been strange goings on in Year 4 as we have been learning all about robots and their use in our society. The children have combined their learning with science and created robots complete with internal electrical circuits, switches and lights.

Our active Year 5 children have been attempting to walk around the world this term by taking part in the Global Children's Challenge! Each child has been given a pedometer to record how many footsteps they walk each day, with the aim reaching an accumulative total that would circumnavigate the globe. Good luck Year 5 and keep walking!

Our Year 6 pupils have started the term with a bang with a residential trip to Condover Hall in Shropshire. An adventure based programme over three days was thoroughly enjoyed by all staff and pupils who will treasure their experiences for a long time!

Finally, a quick update on the school football teams. Every Tuesday we have been taking 2 teams, of mixed year 5 / 6 boys and girls to Southfields School in Kettering to compete in the Kettering Primary Schools League. We are extremely impressed with the attitude and commitment of the children involved and, although we have faced some tough games, the quality of our football and our resilience remains very high. One of the teams even remains unbeaten after 6 weeks of competition.

We would like to thank the parents who transport their (and other's) children to and from the games. We understand how busy you are and greatly appreciate your support.

MVA helping village voluntary groups

The MVA is well aware that many village voluntary groups are facing financially difficult times; so the MVA have considered how it could help.






