### This week! Wednesday 20th November

There will be a KBC staffed exhibition/display of the latest potential housing plans for Mawsley at Mawsley School between 5pm and 8pm on Wed 20th November.

You can comment on these proposals up until Monday 9th December but for a chance to ask questions and discuss them with the planners get to the exhibition!

In a nutshell - from the editor - this is my assessment of the new proposals.

The planning document which News & Views reported on in the spring and which many residents responded to has been updated to take into account the representations made. For Mawsley there has been a considerable change. The field(s) behind Main Street and the Playing Field is/are no longer regarded as potential residential building land. They have been removed from the document. The field (or part of it) between Cransley Rise, Malaslea and Birch Spinney has been now been identified by the planners as a better option.

The document asks for responses similar to those in the last document - basically 'does Mawsley need more housing?' and 'are there reasons why it shouldn't be here?'

This is not a firm proposal to build houses on this site. KBC has to come up with 'potential' sites which will enable it to meet its housing target between now and the year 2030. To achieve this it needs to identify more 'potential' sites than it will actually need.

Please go to the exhibition. Please ask yourself whether Mawsley needs more houses and respond accordingly. It's not clear cut; swings and roundabouts - but what is clear is that some of the arguments and objections that were put forward last time by residents have influenced the outcome. So it is worth responding to the document. See page 29 for how to do that.

At a recent MVA meeting the members discussed a letter from Kelly Fardon concerning an incident by the skate ramps in September. She had witnessed adults whom she thought were not local and who had arrived by car, behaving in an anti-social way and in a manner that caused some of our own youngsters to leave. The letter was also considered by the Parish Council.

### Rob Bailey comments:

What Kelly has described is clearly the abuse of a public amenity towards which Mawsley residents have made a significant contribution, in terms of both time and money. She is absolutely right to say that it's not what the equipment was intended for.

I am aware that the MVA and the Parish Council have taken these concerns very seriously and will continue to discuss ways in which security around the play area can be tightened without reducing accessibility. Already under consideration is the locking of the gate at certain times and/or the installation of lockable bollards. Funding is currently been sought for CCTV coverage around The Centre including this area.

In the meantime, it would be helpful if we could *all* take responsibility for countering anti-social behaviour by reporting it to the appropriate authorities - KBC who own the land, MVA (contact details on page 32) or in extreme cases, to the police. Less serious unacceptable behaviour could be dealt with on the spot; (the dropping of litter, for example).

Thank you for making us aware of this. We certainly don't want any youngsters to be frightened away from the play areas.

I have discussed this with the suppliers, who have completed a full investigation. The root cause is some incorrect advice given to them by the people who make the fencing material.


Our suppliers immediately agreed to fix the problem, entirely at their own expense; and will do so shortly.

### The Pub Site; what next?

The owners of the pub site, a company called Mawsley Taverns (MT) recently contacted our Borough Councillor, Jim Hakewill, requesting a meeting to consider its future. Jim asked me as a Parish Councillor to attend together with two representatives from the Borough Council Planning Dept.

The essence of the discussion was as follows:

### Background:

- MT advised that they bought the site for £130k. (We know that they
  put the site on the market shortly afterwards for £950k; reducing it to
  £650k and then £450k. They had no takers.)
- To date Taylor Wimpey have held a covenant over the land restricting development to a pub. However this covenant has now been lifted.
   Thus the range of potential options for the site is greatly widened.
- When dismissing the appeal relating to house building on the site in 2011 the Planning Inspector determined that the land was to be retained/used as a community asset. This requirement is still in place.

#### Current situation:

- MT confirmed the site has been and still is on the market as a pub site, with no indicative price. No interest has been forthcoming however.
- MT wants to sell it, or at least generate income from it. They need to find a use that will satisfy the 'community asset/ benefit to Mawsley' requirement but which is commercially viable.

# Have you considered becoming a Parish Councillor? Would you like to serve your community and influence its development in this way?

The agenda is also posted on the village noticeboards three clear days before each meeting.

### Possible future options:

- There are no possible options in the pipeline at the moment.
- It seems very unlikely there will be any takers for it as a pub site.
- We discussed what types of use would be of 'benefit to Mawsley' and would also
  justify someone buying the site for that purpose or would generate an
  adequate rental income.
- We considered some possibilities in the meeting, viz.:
  - Church to buy land and build. (This is an option that the Church declined in the planning stages of the village but circumstances may have changed. MT will contact Church.)
  - County Council to buy land for respite accommodation. (MT to progress.)
  - Kettering Borough Council to buy the land for the benefit of the village. (What justification would there be for KBC to do this? The only reason would be to provide some facility for the village that is felt to be essential and missing. Although this option means that the use may not have to be commercially viable, it does raise the question of then having to find the funding to build / create whatever that facility is.)

### So what do you think?


We need some creative thinking to move us beyond this impasse; the site is worth too much for MT to simply hand it back.

- 1. Can you suggest any commercially viable options for the site that would be of benefit to Mawsley?
- 2. Can you think of a facility for the village that is essential and missing that might persuade KBC to buy the land? What does this village still need? What do other villages of a similar size have that we don't? What would help to develop further our sense of being an inclusive (and fun!) community?

It's up to us to consider what uses there may be. If we don't come up with some viable ideas it may then become very difficult for the village to have any influence as to the future use of the land.


Congratulations to 12 year old Tahlia Feasey who is appearing in the 'Fort Boyard Ultimate Challenge' series on iTV.

### Letters to the Editor

Dear Villagers

#### Replacement Windows

Many of you will be aware that Mawsley Village is subject to a number of planning restrictions. My understanding is that any changes to people's houses are subject to full planning permission from the planning department at Kettering Borough Council. In particular KBC are very keen to retain timber framed windows and doors throughout the village in order to preserve the uniformity and appearance of the village. However, in many cases the double glazed timber windows originally installed in the village are not of high quality and may now be in need of repair and maintenance.

Nevertheless I have succeeded in getting planning permission for PVC-U windows and a door at the back of my house on the condition that only timber framed windows are installed at the front. KBC planning insisted that the configuration of the windows and doors for the front and back match the configuration of the existing windows and doors. A further requirement from KBC planning is that PVC -U windows and doors at the rear of the house should not be obviously seen from the public domain i.e. nearby residential roads.

The double glazing contractor I used was very helpful in preparing the planning application and in particular their surveyor prepared detailed drawings on a before and after basis which were required by KBC planning. The double glazing company was not cheap but the quality and energy efficiency of the windows and doors will be greatly superior to the existing windows and doors.

If any villagers would like me to put you in touch with the double glazing contractor I used then please let me know by e-mail. I will also need your address and telephone number.

My new double glazing should be installed in about 4 weeks time so I am looking forward to a warmer winter next year.

Editor: Chris Hobbs' letter raises two interesting points:

- 1. I was surprised that restrictions were applied in his case because his property is not included in the only published list of properties with planning restrictions in Mawsley (now out of date) even though some neighbouring ones are and
- 2. While some upvc windows are VERY plastic looking and would spoil the appearance of Mawsley 'village' others are not.

I asked Kettering Borough Council to clarify point 1 above. They have replied, 'When home owners in Mawsley are considering extending or otherwise making physical changes to the appearance of their homes they are recommended to ask Kettering Borough Council to undertake a constraints check as many properties at Mawsley do not have permitted development rights eg to change windows or extend without first obtaining planning permission. The check is free of charge and details are available by contacting the Council on 01536 534316 or going on line to the following link: <a href="http://www.kettering.gov.uk/site/scripts/download\_info.php?fileID=3473">http://www.kettering.gov.uk/site/scripts/download\_info.php?fileID=3473</a> '. While a free check is obviously helpful I don't think this is satisfactory. I think we would prefer to be able to check for ourselves and I have asked for a list of affected properties.

Turning to point 2 Jim Hakewill, our Borough Councillor, has offered to assist by convening a meeting between affected residents, the planning department and window manufacturers, to explore the possibility that there may now be new modern materials that would be acceptable to the planners and easier to maintain than wood. Once we know which properties are affected this is an offer we would probably want to take up. In the meantime Jim will be happy to hear from any resident for whom this is more urgent. Nah! If you can put your shoes on and walk or drive to The Centre then you're fit enough for us.



### History on our doorstep **Ironstone Mining in Cransley and Loddington** Parish 19th & 20th centuries by Richard Barnwell

I have been asked to write a little about the Ironstone Railway which runs through Cransley Parish from the site just off the A43/A14 and culminates at The Loddington Sidings.

In the late 19th century when the UK ruled the world and it was indeed an empire on which the sun never set the demand for raw materials, particularly iron, was enormous.

Our part of Northamptonshire is rich in seams of Ironstone, hence all the local Ironstone foundries, which were located in and around Kettering and Corby.

In many of our local villages, there were Ironstone quarries where the stone was mined to provide building materials for our local vernacular buildings. If you place yourself back in the mists of antiquity, one of the things essential for an area of habitation was water, fuel (timber) and building materials (timber and stone). This is often why small fields around villages were undulating because they had been quarried for the precious building material. One of the difficulties of quarrying any form of stone was removing the over-burden or top soil which covered the area. The viability of such sites depended on the depth of the top soil, as one has to imagine in the days before machinery, this all had to be moved by hand. The onset of the industrial revolution and all the advances in machinery, particularly steam railways, enabled guarries to be set up some miles from where the raw materials were processed into pig iron. At the end of the 19th century, agriculture was in an extremely impoverished condition and country estates were finding it difficult to keep afloat.

Hence when in the 1880s estate owners were given the possibility of earning an income from the royalties of iron production and were able to sell pieces of land for infrastructure such as railways and furnace areas, they were only too delighted to welcome the new industry. income from the Ironstone completely revitalised The Cransley Estate and enabled Major Thurburn, who purchased the estate in 1903 to commence considerable projects including under-draining the land, rebuilding and extending the farm buildings of his tenants, building new farmhouses and so on. This prosperity lasted up to the beginning of the 1930s when once again there was a national collapse in confidence and the spectre of bankruptcy, or at the very least an



inability to pay one's rent, came once again to the Cransley fields.

The early ironstone workings in Cransley were in the south of the parish and culminated in my fields adjoining the Broughton bypass. These were worked by Plevins & Co as the Cransley Iron Co. from 1875. Little trace of these remain and the early pit was on the site of the recently granted controversial site for the development of a large number of houses on the junction of Coxes Lane and Broughton Hill.

In 1889 a new Company was formed, The New Cransley Iron Steel Company and soon commenced the construction of the new standard gauge line to enable them to get a greater tonnage of ore to the furnaces at the east end of the parish.

The earliest excavations were adjoining my farm buildings at Cransley Lodge in 1894 and the distinct dip in the field can still be seen today. This quarry just clipped the eastern Mawsley village boundary to the south of Cransley Lodge and was served by a narrow gauge steam tramway to the standard line where it went under the bridge then turned west to meet up with the standard line (on the same Level) at the "Docks". The "Docks" was the point at which the standard line terminated and the northern tramway commenced which eventually went as far as the quarries at "Gun Bank" on the Rothwell road to the east of Orton. All excavations from this part ended in 1963 from the Orton Pit and the Mawsley Pit. The Mawsley Pit was the area which now is a wooded area known as the "Firs "which can be seen from Mawsley to the west of Loddington.

The furnace site (Cohen's Yard) was closed shortly after and for a few years British Rail, still reeling from the savage "Beeching" cuts, used the site to store Locomotives and Carriages, brought there from the main St Pancras line at Kettering, before they were cut up for scrap by the famous George Cohen scrap metal merchants.

My maternal Grandfather George Henry Johnson was Managing Director of Stewarts and Lloyds and ran the furnaces at Kettering and Cransley. He had the sad job of closing the furnaces and arranging the demolition of the Chimneys. I remember the occasion well, when his eight grandchildren were asked to push the plungers!

There is one local ironstone engine left that I know of which has been completely restored and that is "Kettering Furnaces No 3" (pictured) which now lives at Penrhyn Castle in North Wales. The engine shed from the site is now in my yard at Cransley and we use it for farm storage.



When the rail lines were taken up in the 1970s the Cransley Farmers whose land it passed through were able to purchase the land and in some places this has been returned to agriculture. My portion of the track now carries the Bridleway from Cransley to Loddington and along this section you can see the wonderful blue engineering bricks which were used to construct the Bridges.

Ironstone which was once so important in Kettering Borough has now (like the Boot and Shoe trade) all but gone but there are still many "Locals" who could tell you many stories about "The Furnaces" and the lives of their fathers and grandfathers. They were all "Real Men" who worked hard to support their families, the parish the borough, the country and ultimately the Empire. We who earn our keep by sitting in an

office and pressing buttons and who have to go to a gym to work off our overindulgence should occasionally give some thought to our recent forbears' lives. Just imagine for a moment all those men trudging on foot to the quarries, doing hard manual work all day, and then having to trudge home again in filthy clothes, come rain or shine. We all have some nostalgia for the past but we should all give thanks to God we were born in a totally different age!
