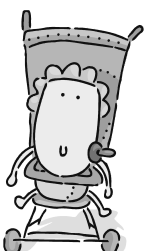

From Mawsley Parish Council

Peter Thomas, Chair of Mawsley Parish Council, reports here on the informative meeting which took place last week. Fourteen residents and representatives from Kettering Borough Council also attended.

What does it feel like to be adopted?

Mawsley can't answer that question.... Yet. But following the September Parish Council meeting, we at least know a little more about where we are with many of the areas that fall within Kettering Borough Council's (KBC) responsibility.

Julia Becket, Deputy Chief Executive of KBC, kindly accepted our request to come to the meeting and update us on a number of issues we've been chasing over the months and years. There was a good turn-out of villagers too, giving us a great opportunity to have a really strong discussion on these issues, and demonstrating the level of concern residents share with us on the Parish Council at the incredibly slow pace of progress.

Playing Field

There's good news, in that the playing field is close to becoming a Queen Elizabeth II Field in Trust, providing a level of protection for this valuable community open space in perpetuity, which will be great for the village. It's just a case of getting the paperwork sorted out now.

Public Open Spaces

Other areas of public open space are now close to adoption by KBC, with a commuted sum being negotiated with Taylor Wimpey (TW). This sum is a figure agreed between the two parties that TW hand over with the land to cover the cost of on going maintenance, normally for a period of 10 years, preventing KBC having a sudden increase in costs. Julia did indicate that while there is no set timescale for these negotiations, the belief was we were looking at weeks or months at worst before agreement is reached.

The Parish Council have in the past, prepared a map of such areas to try to ensure none get 'missed' and we're happy at this stage with the progress now being made. It's taken a long time to get to this point, without doubt, but it at last looks like that light at the end of the tunnel isn't a bloke with a torch coming the other way!

Eco Meadow

The wild flower meadow, off School Road across the road from the school, has been inspected by the Wildlife Trust, at the Parish Council's request. They say it's performing well so far, although it will take time to establish, with the right maintenance and mowing programme being key to this process. KBC are talking to TW about how much their budget for these works will achieve and whether KBC's own team can deliver more for the same money. Either way, at long last, this area is finally showing signs of getting to a point where we want it to be.

Roads and pavements

While the adoption of the roads and pavements is the responsibility of the County Council and not the Borough Council, we have an assurance from Julia she will discuss this with colleagues at County level, to make sure progress is as quick as it can be, recognising again it's been a long time getting to this stage and our patience isn't infinite. All Mawsley's roads are included in these discussions and are intended to be finished and adopted.

Unfortunately, adoption of the areas of the village that are currently owned by David Wilson Homes appears, on the face of it, to be a little less advanced. There have been some concerns recently that these areas wouldn't get adopted, or DWH were going to stop maintaining them. There was a short 'blip' in what has otherwise been excellent maintenance. Some misunderstanding of the processes involved and perhaps the messages being sent out, along with this short-lived pause in maintenance, understandably stirred these fears. At the time of our meeting on 3rd September, KBC were awaiting a response from the DWH board to their suggestion of a suitable figure for the commuted sum to enable adoption to take place. So it looks like the situation is a lot better than some had feared. Negotiations are ongoing and at least KBC and DWH are talking to each other on this, with a clear desire from both sides to get things buttoned up.

Finally

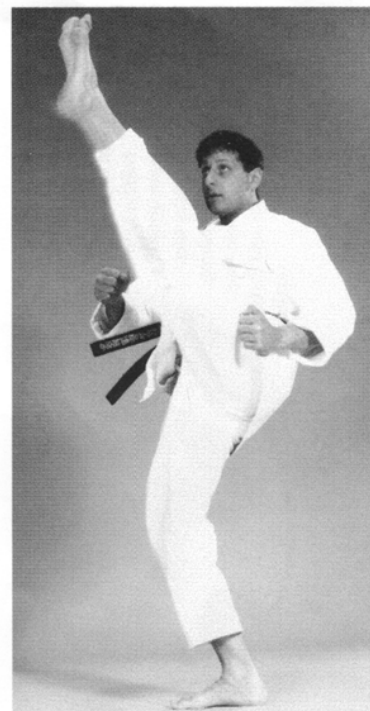
This is by no means a full and comprehensive answer to all our collective questions. We don't know dates for the various steps involved in getting the roads, pavements and open spaces adopted, for instance. Nor is it likely there will ever be fixed dates for this process. This also isn't a full list of all the discussion that took place on the night. It's more aimed at showing there is a clear commitment from KBC to recognise the improvements in communication needed to keep the village up to date with progress. Julia has demonstrated this by saying she'll get us a progress report for our next meeting on October 1st. There's also a determination the part of KBC, echoed by the drive demonstrated by Chris Leeson, Taylor Wimpey's representative who came to our July meeting, to get Mawsley finished.

As promised.
For the benefit and hopefully to the satisfaction of all the village.

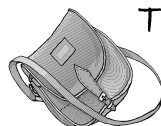

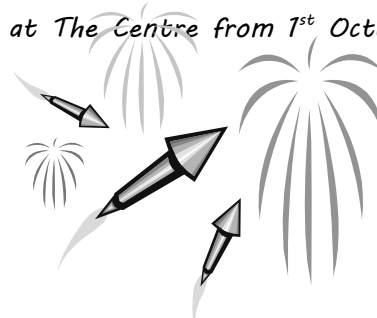

In answer to the comments in the last newsletter from a Mawsley resident complaining that they don't have convenient spaces to park their cars (and Taylor Wimpey don't help with the replacement of a nicely bricked layby on School Road with a pile of mud and weeds for no apparent sensible reason, thereby removing up to 3 parking spaces) all I would ask is that if you have a parking area allocated to your property or garage, please use it. If you however do not have either of these, and have to park in the streets, then please park considerately.

For instance the Highway Code states -

DO NOT stop or park - opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space

For further information, the Highway Code can be found at - http://www.direct.gov.uk/en/TravelAndTransport/Highwaycode/DG_069860

So please don't park opposite residential streets opening on to a T junction, near any junction or any particularly narrow areas of road thereby allowing vehicles wider than a bicycle to get past. (All of these areas are even more difficult to navigate in the winter when there is snow and ice on the road). In particular there is always the worry of emergency vehicles being restricted in access when one of our villagers are at their most vulnerable and in need of help. Remember one day it might be you! *(Name & address supplied)*

In the past few days I have come across vehicles parked in front of the post box, with no room to park in front to post my mail, as the gap was right on top of the junction. Dear Editor

Unadopted...why all the fuss?

Many village residents are aware of the problems of living on our unadopted development for 12 years and the following are just some of the negatives.

1. We have had problems with defective street lighting, foot path, road maintenance, landscaping and street cleaning.
2. The value of a property can be negatively affected if a house is situated on a site that is not adopted.
3. Legal complications and increased associated solicitors' costs can be experienced when dealing with the sale of a property on an unadopted site.
4. Complications can be caused when looking at mortgage approvals.
5. Unmaintained sewers can cause bad smells and hygiene issues.
6. If the developer doesn't get the site adopted the Local Authority in the future can serve notice on the residents of a scheme who are accountable and required to pay for any required works.
7. Car insurance claims can sometimes be questioned if an accident has occurred on a private road (i.e. not adopted)
8. We are not receiving any reduction in council tax or sewer discharge / water rates even though our roads and sewers are not adopted or being maintained by the council!!!!

Unfortunately, the progress by the developers has been less than satisfactory, with just 2 Phases completed in the last 3 years with several interruptions in the work, resulting in even greater deterioration in some locations.

As a result of recent problems with maintenance and landscaping services on the David Wilson (DWH) development, I and several other residents contacted senior personnel at DWH, Kettering Borough Council (KBC) and Northants County Council (NCC) and they have all listed financial restraints and negotiation issues on the adoption settlement and that 20% of the Mawsley site is not on the Phased Adoption Plan.

I also raised this issue at the August 13th Mawsley Parish Council meeting with a request that they seek detailed information from KBC and NCC on the problems affecting the adoption process and that all residents are informed and can make a balanced judgement on the next course of action, such as referral to central government or independent advice.

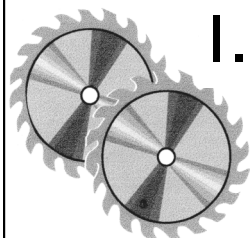

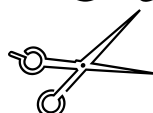

Taylor Wimpey's report on progress in the village.

Programmed works drive forward

Taylor Wimpey's Regional Engineering Manager Chris Leeson is pleased to report that the road surfacing works in Phases 2 (Main Street & The Green), 4 (School Road) and 6 (Cransley Rise & Symonds Way) are nearing completion. The works will soon be ready to advance to the formal maintenance period with Northamptonshire County Council following the completion of the retrospective legal agreements.

Tenders will be sought for the completion of the roads in Phase 3 (Loddington Way) during the first week of September, with work anticipated to commence in October.

Drainage infrastructure inspections will take place as work progresses on Phase 3, while the two foul water pumping stations will be advanced to an adoptable standard in preparation for their handover to Anglian Water.

Legal agreements with Anglian Water have also been formed for the drainage infrastructure for all of the Phase 2 sewers, and will soon be signed.


The open spaces and verges in Mawsley are also being maintained on a regular basis.

Positive feedback

A successful consultation period saw Mawsley residents provide plenty of positive feedback on a series of proposed revisions to line markings and junction arrangements in the village, with only very minor revisions made to the scheme.



The work commenced during the final week of August and it was anticipated the new line marking schemes would be completed in time for the new school term, weather permitting.

People sell a home for many different reasons. Some will be looking to move up or down the property ladder, some will be relocating for work purposes and others may be selling a home on behalf of a family member.

Finally we have 'the auction'. Tried and tested over hundreds of years, the auction is the only sure fire way to sell a property (or 'lot' as it is called) knowing that you will have achieved the best price on the day. It will also alleviate the worry of the deal falling through as contracts are literally exchanged at the fall of the hammer. An auction will cost you some upfront money, such as a contribution towards the catalogue and legal pack (this would still be a cost in other sale methods but later in the transaction). The auction works well if you set your guide price at around 75% of what similar homes are being marketed for. The thing to remember is that the more attractive the guide price is, the more people will come and bid and the more people that bid, the better chances of achieving a good sale price. The auction does have a safety mechanism in that you will, with the estate agent and auctioneer, have set a 'reserve' price. This figure is kept privately and if the bids do not reach it the auctioneer will not sell the 'lot'.

So, next time you ask an estate agent out to value a property ensure they have access to all means necessary in order to achieve the best possible price for you.

If you are unsure about whether you are entitled to a free flu vaccine then please contact the surgery and we will be able confirm this for you and offer you an appointment. Due to the Department of Health strict guidance on a patient's entitlement to a flu vaccine, we cannot offer them to patients not meeting the above criteria. Crime on the increase

It was good to have PCSO Margaret Lawson and PC Martin Penhallow at last week's Parish Council meeting to provide the latest crime figures and discuss them with Councillors and residents. The news wasn't good.

There were 16 crimes in Mawsley last month including burglaries, theft from vehicles and of vehicles. Old Gorse Way appears to have been a particular target at the end of August.

The message from the officers was that in this warmer weather residents are more likely to be careless about leaving doors and windows open and opportunists will take advantage of any insecurity. We were told of thefts from open garages and homes while residents were at home mowing the back lawn or upstairs in the house.

Even locked up and over garage doors are relatively easy to open. The officers advised that padlocked bolts through the frame are the best way of making them secure. They also told us that everyone under suspicion of theft is scanned at the police station for SmartWater, so this is still a useful way of protecting your property.

Message from PC Penhallow

My message this month is about making sure that people leave their vehicles, home and garages secure.

We have had a spate of burglaries/thefts in Mawsley and all but 2 were insecure.

This also includes not leaving valuables on display in your home and vehicle and making sure you are vigilant at all times with security, even when you're out washing your car or mowing the grass. Please don't leave unattended vehicles, homes, businesses and garages insecure. It only takes a minute for someone to walk in and take a laptop or mobile phone etc. **Remember you may not be insured if you leave property insecure.**

The police have increased patrols in the area and are investigating all the crimes, but please don't make easy for them. Always think SECURITY.

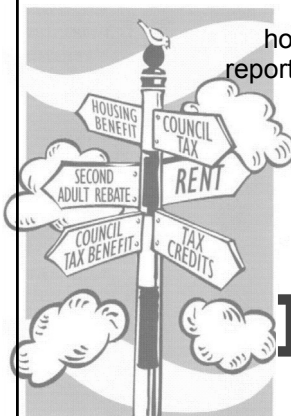
