VILLAGER REQUEST FOR DONATIONS

Mawsley Parish Council are now at an advanced stage with Northamptonshire County Council and a plan to have three much needed bus shelters within our village.

This plan has been developed on the passenger volumes of Stagecoach and School Transport operators who share a total of 134 students and pupils who travel to the various education facilities daily, within the county and an estimated 30 will join this number from our local Primary School next term.

Additionally an estimated 60 visit our village daily, to attend the Medical Centre and the other facilities we offer.

Obviously, the lack of shelters has created concerns and awareness from our residents and Parish Council has acted on this by supporting the project and is now considering the options on funding the estimated cost of £28,400.

This cost is an extensive burden on the resources of Parish Council and we are in the process of generating contributions from our local business and traders, together with our resident groups.

Gardening For All

Tips for Early June - Shade loving plants need protecting with a layer of leaf-mould to help retain moisture during dry spells. Water all containers once a day preferably in the cool of early evening. Try to make this a routine task you will find it soon becomes a precious time, far removed from the rigours of everyday life. A little bit of 'me/us time'. Clip back any plants that are becoming straggly or invasive.

As usual it has been a busy time for Gardening for All since the last edition of 'The Villager'.

MAWSLEY VILLAGE SURGERY

Our opening hours for the surgery are: Monday, Tuesday,Wednesday, Friday 8am to 6pm and we provide a late clinic on a Thursday 8am to 7.30pm. Due to feedback, the late clinic has been extended to include Doctor, Nurse and Health Care appointments.

The dispensary has extended its hours and now opens:

Monday to Friday 9am to 12pm and 1pm to 6pm only closing for 1 hour at lunch time and opening around clinic times for your convenience and this will continue. The Pharmacy is now open in the Village but our services we provide will not change. The dispensary will still be dispensing medication as before.

We are continuing with all the existing services we provide which include Minor Injury, Minor Surgery, Ante-natal and Post-natal care, Contraception advice, Insurance Medicals, HGV and Taxi Medicals, Dispensing of medication, Phlebotomy, Asthma/Diabetes/Heart Disease, vaccinations (travel and routine), Cervical smears, Child Health Surveillance, Weight management and wound care. In addition to this we have been offering National Health checks.

We have also been offering extra on the day appointment over the winter period to help with Same Day demand. We will be offering extra Health Reviews of our elderly population from April.

Nature on <u>Your</u> doorstep - a stroll round Mawsley & District by Les & Paul (not exactly a stroll just us two old boys sitting in the garden).

It was one of those rare occasions in late April when you could sit outside enjoying a drink in the garden without turning blue. The mercury on the thermometer had topped 20°C during the day and the nagging wind had dropped completely. As the day drew to a close the blackbird sang its last tired notes and the restless Robin disappeared into the clematis for the night. Suddenly out of the corner of my eye I saw a bat. It was small so I suggested probably a Pipistrelle. However, my knowledge of bats and their species identification is poor to non existent. So I decided to learn more.

The place a bat lives is called its roost. Bats need different roosting conditions and they will often move around to find one that meets their needs. Some bats prefer hollow trees, some like caves and some use both at different times. Many bats shelter in buildings, churches, behind hanging tiles and boarding or in roof spaces.

There are 17 species of bat to be found in Britain. Ranging from the magnificent Long Eared bat with a head and body length of up to 50mm with extremely long ears (nearly as long as its body) and a forearm of up to 41mm. To the smallest bat in Britain the Common Pipistrelle with head and body length of up to 35mm but small ears and a forearm of up to 32mm. There are several species of bat resident in Northamptonshire. The Wildlife Trust have recorded 5 at Pitsford reservoir being the Serotine, Daubenton's, Noctule, Common Pipistrelle and Soprano Pipistrelle. With bats ranging up to 4.5km away from their roost to forage it is reasonable to assume some may well be seen over Mawsley. A recent survey identified 3 rarer species in the area namely the Barbastrelle, Leisier's bat and Nathusis Pipestrelle.

The Northants Bat Group have been carrying out bat surveys for 20 to 30 years and confirm that there are 12 species which have been spotted in the county.

How to spot bats:- If you go out 20 minutes after sunset you can often see them overhead in search of insects. Pregnant females come together around May to create breeding colonies. Several species can be found feeding on insects over rivers and lakes and maybe your garden pond if you are lucky. Whereas others choose wooded areas.
