# The Pub Site

As you are probably aware Taylor Wimpey have been wanting to build houses on the 'pub site' for some time. Last summer they put in an application to build 10, later reduced to 8, houses on the site next to The Centre and playing field and opposite Mawsley Medical. Many villagers signed a petition against this and attended two planning meetings at Kettering Borough Council with the result that the Planning Office turned down the application.

Taylor Wimpey have now appealed to the Government against that decision. Janet Redman, Parish Councillor, is coordinating the objection of villagers against this. She said 'it is important that everyone in Mawsley is aware of the possibility that 8 houses could be built on that central site and if they don't want that to happen we need them to send in their objection to the Planning Inspector. Every objection is important and we need to make our opinions known to the Planning Inspector so that they know the people of Mawsley are against the building of houses on the 'former pub site' And they need to do it before 1st February.'

Janet has organised a leaflet drop so that everyone knows who to write to and the details from the leaflet are also given here.

#### Maintenance and the Adoption Process

Phase Two of the road works, from the pond down to the surgery, will include improvements in the road layout from The Green at Barnwell Court and through the island opposite The Centre. The work starts on Monday the 24th January and the residents affected have been informed.

This should improve traffic access through The Green particularly for the bus and potential emergency vehicles.

The work will include granite sett overrun areas [*the same as Phase One*] and will prevent damage to grassed islands that have been overrun.

#### Proposed bus shelter and further extension to the bus route

We are still waiting for approval from Taylor Wimpey on the allocation of the land for the bus shelter at Loddington Way and the justification of the cost versus the passenger numbers in that location will be reviewed through Parish Council.

County Council have not replied to the request for a further extension to the bus route.

#### Mawsley Church is here for all

The New Year brings a new pattern of services for the Parish of St. Andrew's in Cransley with Mawsley. We saw many people over Christmas at the various services both at The Centre and in the Parish Church of St. Andrew's in Cransley. I speak to lots of people who are surprised that we have services in The Centre.

In 2011 we are meeting twice a month. SPACE on Sunday is on the first Sunday of every month. It is your chance to enjoy a cup of coffee and a bacon buttie, space just to step away from it all. Children can enjoy the 'Children's SPACE' with bible based activities and anyone can spend time in the 'Quiet SPACE' for personal reflection and prayer. It's not a service like a regular church but with a thought for the day in the bar it is a fresh expression of church for those who may have spiritual beliefs but don't relate to church as we know it.

On the third Sunday of each month there is a more usual service where we will sometimes meet in the bar and sometimes in the hall, sing some hymns or songs, listen to the bible and a short talk, and think about God and life today.

If a traditional church service is what you are looking for, then St. Andrew's has a different service each week. See below.



# MAKING PROGRESS

We hear lots of comments from people upset about the state of the roads, or street lights not working properly, construction vehicles obstructing roads and many other problems that stem from Mawsley still being a 'bit of a building site'. By all means, tell us of your concerns, but there's not very much the Parish Council can do to about these shared problems. It's important to be talking to the right people if you're to stand any chance of getting anything done about them.

#### Responsibility

Until the village is adopted, then most issues are the responsibility of the developers. Taylor Wimpey have most of this responsibility and they can be contacted on 0116 281 6445. If you have street light issues in areas covered by Barratt Homes, you need to contact them on 01604 664500 and for David Wilson areas you'll need 01604 478400.

#### **Regular** Contact

Please do contact them with any concerns or defects. It's easy to think your one phone call isn't going to make any difference, but if no-one tells them there's a problem, then they're definitely not going to do anything. Plus, if enough people make enough noise, they may well sort things out just for a quieter life! It can help to get hold of the e-mail address of the person who will deal with an issue and keep in regular contact with them, asking for progress reports. Don't be a deliberate nuisance; just let them know you're still there...

#### Council

If you want to be heard at Borough or County Council levels, then the contacts section of this newsletter tells you who to get in touch with. Our individual Councillors may not be able to deal directly with your enquiry, but they'll certainly know which department or council officer to talk to. Plus, we vote for them and they're always keen to know what it is their voters get worked up about. That's what'll get them elected next time, after all.






