### **PUB SITE SAVED!**

4 simple words: "I dismiss the appeal." Taken from the report by the planning inspector, Ian Radcliffe, in reaching his decision on Taylor Wimpey's appeal, over the refusal by KBC to allow planning permission to build 8 houses on what we all call "the pubsite".

Many of you will have received an e-mail telling you, more will have heard it from friends, or read it on the forum. There are not going to be 8 houses built on that land! Not now anyway, and probably not ever!

People are already asking: "What's next?" Well, the cynic in me would say, let's look out for the next application in 12 months time. Re-worded, re-packaged, re-presented, but essentially the same. But I'm not sure that's all that likely. The inspector could have dismissed the appeal on many grounds. Anyone who was at the appeal hearing will tell you how close it was. Visual amenity; character and appearance; shortage of housing; noise nuisance; viability as a pub site, all were cited as reasons for refusal. Actually, even with those arguments, it seems the decision was finely balanced, until the loss of a potential, community enhancing facility was factored in. Then it all swings our way.

The inspector acknowledges the pub site was "a major selling point which attracted people to move to the village", and that planning guidance at the concept stage for Mawsley "identified a public house could form the focus of a community and should therefore be included within the new village." All this would render the failure to at least allow the opportunity for development of a pub, contrary to the objectives of North Northants Core Spacial Strategy. He refers to there being no realistic alternative locations for a pub, as well as recognising that the potential increase in available housing doesn't outweigh the advantages to our community, should the development of a pub be realised.

It appears that a simple reworking of a planning application for houses on this plot, presented some time in the future, will not counter any of the arguments offered by the inspector in support of his decision. This is almost as satisfying as the decision itself. It means that, until we have an economic environment within which the successful development of a public house is viable, it's extremely unlikely any other permanent development will take place.

This underlines the importance of creating a real, sustainable community, as well as highlighting what a difference such a community can make by joining together. The support of those who turned out for the appeal hearing, as well as those who couldn't make it, but submitted their objections, was invaluable.

I'm not interested in gloating. We won our argument, but it was very close. And it's only business to the developers, but our lives, village, community and surroundings to us. This wasn't a case of us against them, or individuals beating the big, faceless corporation. This was about us identifying, as a community, what was right for our village, and standing up for it.

Well done to everyone who had any part in that, but particular thanks to Bob Littler for talking so eloquently at all the planning hearings, Borough Councillor Jim Hakewill, for being so passionate about realising the concept of Mawsley as a proper village community, and all those members of that very community, without whose submissions and representations, we may easily have lost this particular battle. So well done Mawsley! We can pull together when it matters, and we will do it again if and when we need to. Now.... Who's for a drink.....?

### TAYLOR WIMPEY – PROGRESS UPDATE

### Paint points to progress as roads receive their finishing touches

Yellow paint has appeared on roads and paths around Mawsley, marking out a programme of works that will soon be under way. The paint identifies points where Taylor Wimpey will be carrying out remedial work to roads, paths, kerbs and streetlights, and can currently be seen in Loddington Way, Paddock End, Ellis Lane, School Road, Scholars Row, Symonds Way, Cowslip Hill, Jibwood, Cransley Rise and Link Lane.

Taylor Wimpey has also announced a timetable of road surfacing and associated works that will see two further phases of the village completed this autumn and winter. The final phase is due to be finished by summer 2012, dependent on the local builder finishing his work to schedule. Top surfaces are not being applied to roads still being used regularly by heavy construction vehicles.

Over the past days, Taylor Wimpey has also been carrying out a range of remedial works across several areas of the village, including repainting white lines where they have faded, and carrying out planting and maintenance to public open spaces. Potholes and streetlights will continue to be fixed as necessary, and residents are invited to telephone Colin Radford (Engineering Manager) on 0116 281 6403 to advise of any areas requiring immediate attention.

### **Maintenance and the Adoption Process**

The recent announcement and letter from Steve Farmer of Taylor Wimpey relating to the village infrastructure and completion of the road works to adoption standards, is very welcome news and is an indication that the work will be carried out progressively within a reasonable time frame.

Taylor Wimpey have also provided a direct contact for residents that can now be used to resolve any issues with maintenance, up until the eventual handover and adoption by both county and borough councils.

The complete adoption process involves more than just the roads, and so involves both the Borough and County Councils. It extends beyond finishing the road surfacing and kerbs etc., and getting all the street lighting working properly, to also include landscaping, conservation of trees and ancient hedgerows, the eco-meadow and the village pond. We can all support these issues which will enhance the environment we live in through Parish Council representation to the Borough Council and continued voluntary involvement within the community.

### Parish Council News

### **Taylor Wimpey Progress**

On 22<sup>nd</sup> June, Councillors Bob Holland, Vic Cope & I met with Steve Farmer, Managing Director of Taylor Wimpey – East Midlands, and other key personnel at their head office in Leicester, to discuss many of the current village issues. The meeting was very positive, with Mr. Farmer expressing both his desire to "deliver" on the concept of Mawsley, and also his regret that communication recently between TW and the village had been lacking. The letter from him setting out the plans for completion of the roads etc., which you should have all received by now, was shown to us at that meeting. I know the developers have a vested interest in making sure they finish off the outstanding works as quickly and with as little fuss as possible. Plus, I can see they will benefit from an overall level of customer satisfaction when holding up Mawsley as a shining example of what they can achieve. But I can assure you all that his conviction and determination to achieve those goals, was both genuine and reassuring. It"s still going to be a difficult process – both for us, and them - with inconvenience and problems along the way. But there is a very bright light at the end of what has been, for many, a very long tunnel. Having set out these plans in as open a way as they have, Taylor Wimpey will now be under pressure to meet their own timescales and deliver on their promises. This can only be good for the village.

It was underlined at the meeting that the person, as named in the letter, to contact for the remainder of Taylor Wimpey's time ,on site"; with street light defects, potholes, road/pavement issues, etc; is Colin Radford. Please don"thesitate to contact him with any issues. Without a daily presence on site, they don"t necessarily know about new potholes etc. without being told - by us. If identifying holes, lights out, or similarly specific problems, you just need to tell Colin the street the problem is on and which house number it is nearest to. It"s deliberately not complicated and they will try to resolve any such issues quickly and effectively.

### **Dog Orders**

In other news, June saw the implementation of Kettering Borough Council"s Dog Orders. This means it will be an offence to not immediately remove dog fouling from anywhere within the Borough of Kettering. It will also make it an offence not to put your dog on a lead of no longer than 1.5 metres, when so instructed by an authorised officer of Kettering Borough Council. I don"t expect we"ll see much need for these rules to be enforced here in Mawsley. I"m happy and proud to say that we have a large majority of very responsible dog owners in our village. It does, though, give the local authority the powers they need to crack down on the minority within the borough, who need bringing to task over their selfish and unthinking behaviour where their dogs are concerned.

### **Parish Council Minutes**

Some people have expressed concern over the accessibility of Parish Council meeting minutes. These are a subject of public record, and are available by contacting the Parish Council Clerk directly, or on the Mawsley Village website. It is important to note, however, that these are only publicly available once agreed and signed off at the monthly Parish Council meeting following the one to which the minutes relate. This is a statutory obligation on the part of the Parish Council, and means the minutes are always, therefore, a month or so behind. So if there is a particular issue you re keen to keep up to date with, then the best way is to attend a Parish Council meeting, and listen to the issue being discussed "live".

### **Parish Councillor Vacancy**

Finally, we now have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. Should any of you feel there is a need for an election to fill this role, then e-mail the Parish Clerk before the 26<sup>th</sup> July. If not enough people request an election, then the Parish Council will ask for volunteers to step forward for consideration to be co-opted onto the council. It started, and it snowhere near as uncomfortable as it sounds!
