

Mawsley Fete & Cider Festival - this coming Saturday!!

We've had a summer village fun day in Mawsley since at least 2002 and since long before there were any village facilities. The earliest ones were held on the land round the pond and the nearby Loddington Road houses and, so that nowhere should feel left out, the children's games took place on the green in Warren End. People who lived closest opened their houses to provide toilet facilities (or people were close enough to dash home!) and we discovered that there wasn't a party tent made which could withstand Mawsley winds. We wrote off quite a few of those in the early days but never gave up because the beer tent was always an important part of the event.

In 2003 there were Fun Runs with obstacles round the village (which only extended as far as Ellis Lane then) in the morning followed by the usual fun and games in the afternoon. In 2004 we used the playing field (no building there) for the first time but had to move off it the following year when it was being properly seeded so used the 'pub site' instead.

There used to be an MVA Social Committee of five or six people who organised these relatively small scale but very enjoyable events. Once The Centre opened the scope and scale of Fun Day was able to change and it became a large undertaking making use of all The Centre facilities and all the playing field and we have been fortunate to have a series of volunteers each year This year, as you may have noticed, it is being called a Fete for the first time. It is being organised by Sarah Hart with the staff at The Centre and they have decided to take us back to a traditional village fete, an affordable fun day for all the family. There will be loads to do and see but entry will be free, the play areas and displays in the arena are free and there will be lots of very affordable sideshows run by village groups. There will be plenty of room on the field for you to put down your travelling rug and chairs and make your base for the afternoon.

True to Mawsley tradition there will also be plenty for the grown-ups. Nine different traditional Weston's ciders from Much Marcle to sample, not in a flimsy party tent this time but in the very solid committee room which you have to pass on your way onto the field and Pimms in quite a solid tent. And for anyone who wants to do serious shopping there will be commercial stalls both inside and out. (See the programme on page 17 for more details.)

We know that Sarah and the team are now expert in rescuing events from the rain, so come rain or shine it is going to be a brilliant afternoon.

Update from Taylor Wimpey

Key roads decisions are made

Taylor Wimpey's Regional Engineering Manager Chris Leeson attended Mawsley Parish Council's June meeting to outline the proposed programme of works in the village.

The councillors unanimously agreed on which road line marking designs to submit to Northamptonshire County Council for approval (see page 7), while Chris also reported tenders have been received for the next two phases of remedial and completion works to roads, with contracts due to be signed in July.

Drainage

Encouraging news has been received from Anglian Water which has fully approved the drainage infrastructure for all the phase two sewers. Work can now progress on the formal legal agreements which, along with the topping of roads, will be the catalyst for a certificate of completion of works.

Maintenance

Grass cutting and maintenance is now scheduled on a regular basis, and positive comments have been welcomed from residents who have been pleased with the village's appearance as a result.

Anyone for Cricket?

The Centre at Mawsley Wednesday 18th July 2012 at 6pm . An invitation from Cllr Jim Hakewill Mayor of Kettering Borough.

The sound of leather on willow is perhaps one of the first things that comes to mind when you think of a typical English village. Sun shining, smartly dressed cricketers easily picked out on a grassy green carpet cut and trimmed for the occasion.

What better way to continue to mark the continuing ambition for Mawsley to take its place as a traditional Northamptonshire village than to welcome Councillors, officers, friends and family to the Centre and its facilities. The occasion being a cricket match between the Mayor's team and officer colleagues.

For many years, long before Kettering Borough, was created within its current boundaries, there was an annual cricket match between the Rural District and Kettering Urban District council. It was a great way to socialise between the two councils, have something to eat and especially to go to the different towns and villages so that Councillors could see the communities that they didn't often get the chance to visit.

Looking back at the records my first attendance at the annual match was when my father took me to the Weekly Glebe, Kettering. That was the 14th July 1966 (aged 12!). He scored 54 runs that evening before being caught and bowled. Please don't expect anything like that from me on the 18th July!

The moment I was elected as Deputy Mayor I wanted to reintroduce this cricket match, which had subsequently become a Councillor versus officer match and then for some years hasn't been played at all. What a brilliant thing, I thought, if we could go back to the original concept and create an occasion for Mawsley to take centre stage!

As I write this, the two "sides" are recruiting players, The Centre is laying on food and everything is planned for a lovely social evening with an element of cricketing competition.

The Mayor's Charity this year is the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution (RABI). They reach out and support farming families in times of crisis by giving grants for things like stair lifts, temporary workers when accidents happen and generally look after the interests of farming families when they are finding it hard to carry on. There will be a raffle on the night and any surplus from food sales will all go to the charity.



I hope you will get along on the night and we will all have an enjoyable evening putting Mawsley firmly on the Map!

We were very pleased to have Chris Leeson from Taylor Wimpey and Phil Brown from JPP Consulting at the June Parish Council meeting. Taylor Wimpey have tasked Phil (coincidentally a Mawsley resident himself) with designing the road layouts for approval by the County Council Highways department. Both Taylor Wimpey and County Council have put local consultation high on their agenda to ensure an acceptable solution is reached for all parties, as much as is practical. This consultation demonstrates a new chapter of much better, more direct and more positive communication with us by Taylor Wimpey, building on the many years of effort made by the Parish Council on your behalf to foster such a working relationship. We're not home and dry yet, but this new approach, as we get closer to completion of the adoption process, is a really positive development at this critical time.

Phil and Chris were able to present a timetable for finishing off the roads, discuss the various phases of the adoption process and present some proposed changes to the layout of road junctions as shown on the plans you can see opposite. At this stage there are three main areas that are being considered and as part of the changes proposed we were given the opportunity to express our views before the works take place. All the Councillors thought these changes made sense and if you want to see them, there are more detailed versions of the plans in a folder in the bar at The Centre.

Other works may be planned around the village as part of the on-going adoption process, which will be presented to the village for views to be expressed, as necessary. For now the sketches on the following page show the intended works.

As you'll see from this, there are a lot of things already happening and a lot that still need to. But the plan is to have all phases of the works completed this year to bring the roads, pavements etc. up to adoption standard. There may still be some delays with aspects of this, as outside agencies (such as Anglian Water) are also involved. But we can assure you the Parish Council will be in constant contact with Taylor Wimpey to ensure the momentum is maintained. They for their part are keen to complete things and move on, freeing themselves of the financial commitment to Mawsley, but aren't able to until everything is right. So by working together, we hope we'll be able to deliver a finished Mawsley sooner rather than later.

Loddington Way/ School Road junction \rightarrow

The removal of the triangular island to make this junction a conventional priority junction has been proposed. This would:

- provide more space for vehicles, in particular buses, turning right out of School Road
- improve visibility for road users turning on to Loddington Way
- allow the cycle way crossing points to be moved away from the junction
- allow a new footpath to be built for pedestrians to safely cross Loddington Way





← Surgery junction

There are plans to change the priority of the Mawsley Chase/Hawthorn Avenue junction to combat the problems of vegetation obscuring the view of road users.

It's also proposed to paint double yellow lines near to the steps leading to the surgery and pharmacy in School Road to prevent drivers from parking across the pedestrian crossing point.

School safety

Parking restrictions are planned for School Road and Scholars Row at the beginning and end of the school day.

There are also proposals to make Scholars Row one-way to make the school run safer for pedestrians and motorists.

There are more detailed plans of these proposed changes in a folder in the bar at The Centre. (They're too large to go on the wall!)

LITTER PICKING



Following the article in the last News & Views and in response to enquiries from villagers asking where they can get the necessary equipment to pick up litter in their area, the Parish Council has purchased six sets which can be borrowed.

To make life easier for everyone, we now have volunteers who will be looking after this equipment. Please contact the volunteer nearest you and they will lend you the pickers but, needless to say, the loan of this equipment will have to be entirely at your own risk. So, to comply with safety requirements - before you take the equipment - you will be asked to read a disclaimer confirming that you are using the equipment at your own risk. If you are happy with this, you will be asked to sign a book to confirm you have borrowed the equipment and then when you have brought it back the volunteer will sign it back in. It may seem a bit formal but this is the only way we can keep track of the sets which, believe it or not, have cost in excess of £150. Each set comprises: 1 litter picker, 1 hoop and a couple of bags.

When returning the equipment you will be informed where to put the bags for collection or whether to leave them with the volunteer – we are awaiting confirmation from Kettering BC as to any special collection requirements they may have. The equipment will be available from:-

We would ask please that you ring the person concerned before turning up at their house so that you know whether the equipment is already out on loan or not.

A big thank you to everyone who responded to the article and was willing to do their bit – now we will be able to keep Mawsley up to scratch (*despite the Mawsley winds*) and make it a village to be really proud of.

Dear Editor

A salutary alert to Mawsley residents: On the night of the 25th June a large brown urn shaped plant pot was stolen from outside my house on Cowslip Hill. I have owned it for many years and it has great sentimental value. It was planted with a small shrub.

Given the large number of gardens around the village that are enhanced by beautiful potted flowers and shrubs, my experience is perhaps a warning that plant pots left outside are vulnerable. It would have taken two people to move mine. No doubt it's a sign of the times.

I informed the police and we had a visit from the community police officer the next day - which is reassuring. At least one other planter had been stolen that night and the soil and contents were discovered by the first entrance to the village. He suggested that the culprits, (there must have been at least two of them as the pot was so heavy), were not from the village, and may have emptied the pot to lighten their load on their

way out. He also suggested staking down outdoor pots to deter further theft.

Multi-Storey Car Park

Tip of the month

Disease on Roses

Because of the unusual weather in the winter and spring, it seems to be that the usual fungal diseases affecting roses, like blackspot and mildew, have become a problem earlier than usual this year. It is common around the village to see rose bushes that have lost a lot of their leaves far earlier than they should have done because of these diseases.

What can be done about it in future? If you are a gardener who is not averse to using sprays then these days the recommendation seems to be to apply a fungicide as early as February; this is often successful in preventing a major problem. Otherwise let nature take its course.
