Chris was the first to recognise that the planning commitment's vague specification for a "community building", would inevitably become a large and complex building that would have to meet the widely varying needs of the entire village. Even then it was clear that a pub was unlikely to be built in the foreseeable future, so what became The Centre at Mawsley also had to take on that role too. As such, it would have to plan to be a professional business, and couldn't be the archetypal village hall run by volunteers.

Chris developed all the financial processes and controls which allow us to manage the business in a transparent way, and protect your money. The success of this is apparent in the fulsome approval within the independent assessment of it by Hawsons (a firm of accountants) last year for the way in which The Centre is run. Chris pushed for and implemented the superb HD 93" TV system, and the recently installed amazing new "mood lighting". Chris lead many other things; a list too long to run through, but throughout he has been the guardian of the village's money – keeping a close eye on all spending.

Thank you Chris; without you the village would not be what it is today. On behalf of the MVA and all the village I wish Yvonne and yourself every success and happiness in the future.

This of course brings us on to who is going to take on all the work that Chris used to do? At the moment Simon Wisdom and I have picked it up; however we really would like to see some new faces taking on some of these (and other) responsibilities. This is desirable at the moment, but I suspect some time soon will become essential.

Flu Vaccines

A reminder that we are fast approaching the Flu vaccination period in the surgery. We are expecting vaccine supplies from the 3rd week of September so please visit our web site <u>www.mawsleymedical.co.uk</u> for information about flu clinics.

If you suffer with asthma, chronic heart disease, renal failure, COPD and bronchitis, cancer or if you are 65 years and over then you are entitled to receive a flu vaccine. If you are unsure about whether you are entitled to a free flu vaccine then please contact the surgery and we will be able confirm this for you and offer you an appointment. If you do fall within any of the above groups and you do not wish to receive a vaccine, please call us to let us know. Our telephone number is 01536 791300.

Patients who do not fall into any of the above groups but still wish to receive a flu vaccine can do so but will have to pay £10.00 per vaccine. Please book an appointment if you wish to receive a vaccine.

Maintenance and Adoption Process

Kettering Borough Council has recently announced an agreement with Parish Council to formally adopt the pond location as part of the Phase One [Broughton Road] adoption procedures. We have requested that the future conservation of the pond remains within the community and have shown our support through MVA and its volunteers who took part in the working party, carried out on the 27TH August.

<u>Bus route</u>

Stagecoach and Northampton County Council have replied to the request by the Village Bus User Group to extend the bus route beyond the Medical Centre. NCC was in favour of the proposal, but has withdrawn financial support to the service. Stagecoach has declined the request based on the road network and the current roadwork's situation. They have also stated that changes in scheduling, the additional time and the provision of an extra bus cannot be funded at this time.

Bus Shelter.

Parish Council are considering and are in consultation with Taylor Wimpey, Kettering Borough Council and Northampton County Council on the transfer of the land at Loddington Way for the positioning of a bus shelter.

Parish Council Update

Parish Councillor Vacancy

As mentioned in the last newsletter, there's currently space for one more Parish Councillor. We gave people time to request an election for this position if they wanted. Not enough people did, so we now need to co-opt a new Councillor. This means the existing Councillors have to select someone from those who put themselves forward. We've decided the best way to do this is to meet each candidate, get an idea of their reasons for standing, what they feel they can bring to the role and where they might fit in with the mix of people we already have on the council.

So if you think you'd like to be a Parish Councillor, let our Parish Clerk, Diana MacCarthy, know by 20th September, by e-mailing: <u>mawsleyclerk@tiscali.co.uk</u>. You don't need to give us your life history at this stage. Just name, address, phone number and e-mail address will be fine. Please do this even if you've already said you'd like to stand; just to be sure you're still interested. Minutes

From now on, once the minutes of Parish Council meetings are ready for publication, we're going to put them up on the village notice boards. They will still be about a month old when they appear, but hopefully this improvement will make it easier for you to see what we're doing, and will improve the link between the Parish and its' Council.

Report all Crime!

We've heard of a few thefts of garden ornaments, lights etc. We receive a report from the Police at each monthly meeting, on the crime figures for our village. It's clear every month how lucky we are, with those figures being comparatively very low. But we rarely see anything on there about these minor thefts, vandalism, malicious damage etc. However, the police will always tell you to report all crime. A missing birdbath may be an inconvenience rather than crime of the century. But it's anti-social at best, and definitely criminal activity. Minor crimes or anti-social behaviour can be part of a pattern, helping to detect larger, more serious crime. This doesn't mean a missing wheelie bin, or solar lights relocated in next-door's garden are going to lead to a massive crime-wave. Just that the Police can more easily identify any pattern, and then target their resources better, if they know about crimes being committed. We have a safe, relatively crime-free village. Keeping the police informed and on top of what's going on will certainly help to keep it that way.

A Vision for Mawsley

The roads improvement programme is moving forward at quite a pace. It's a bit of a mess as things get done, but soon (we hope) we won't have raised manholes, unfinished roads or inadequate road markings. The village infrastructure will then begin to become the responsibility of the Borough and County Councils respectively. So now is the time to tell them what we, the village, want to see in certain key areas in Mawsley.

The Eco-meadow as it's known (the big field on School Road, opposite and downhill from the school) is one such area, as is the village green. There's been any number of ideas over the years, as to what, if anything, we might do with these areas of village land. The Borough Council will own these areas, and it will be them, ultimately, who decide what can and can't happen. But public consultation on well-thought out, detailed plans, for the shaping of these village assets for future generations, will certainly help them in their decision making.

We want to discuss the ideas that you come up with at meeting at the start of October. So we'd like to receive anything you want to put forward by the end of September. Ideas to the Clerk, or any of the Parish Councillors, via e-mail; phone; or good, old-fashioned, face-to-face conversation, will be more than welcome.

Taylor Wimpey Progress Report

Taylor Wimpey's programme of road surfacing is now well under way in Mawsley.

Teams have been working hard on the resurfacing of Main Street's road and paths, which is expected to be completed by mid-September. They will then focus on the School Road and Cowslip Hill areas of the village. It is anticipated the entire resurfacing programme for this area will be completed in time for Christmas, ahead of the final phase of the development being completed by summer 2012, dependent on the local builder finishing his work to schedule.

Potholes and streetlights will continue to be fixed as necessary, while remedial work is continuing throughout the village, including repainting white lines and carrying out planting and general maintenance to public open spaces.
